Further to our telephone conversation and e-mail correspondence in connection with IPPC Application for Greenskips Services Ltd. (IP 001/12/A).

Hospital waste

For any hospital waste (including cytotoxic waste) that is declared to be radiation free by the hospital would not be considered as being radioactive, if Greenskips discovers any radioactive material in such waste they should contact the Radiation Protection Board.

Smoke detectors

If Greenskips decides to offer a service to export smoke detectors in the future, it may fall within the scope of Legal Notice 44 of 2003 (and LN 186 of 2013) and therefore would need to notify the Radiation Protection Board as the first step. I am not sure if the export of domestic smoke detectors needs an IPPC permit.
