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

Section 11 – Details on Information and Awareness Campaigns

Meetings for producers were held in August and September to explain the legal obligations and implications of the WEEE Legal Notice 204 of 2014. At least three meetings were held where all members of the business community were invited to attend and their legal obligations were explained.

In addition a number of one to one visits to producers were held at their own premises to explain the same issues.

Communications were made with Local Councils who in the period stated that they have a guideline from the Department of Local Government not to enter into agreements with WEEE Schemes for the time being.
