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Introductory Note

The enclosed notice of variation shall be read in conjunction to the permit with reference to IP 00102/22 and shall take effect as of the date indicated below. The Authority is hereby varying Section 3 and including Schedule 8 to the current IPPC permit (IP 00102/22) as specified hereunder.

The following Variation Notice is granted under Regulation 7 of the Industrial Emissions (Framework) Regulations, 2013 (S.L. 549.76) (“the Industrial Emissions (Framework) Regulations”) to operate an installation carrying out activities covered by the description in 5.1 and 5.5 in Schedule 1 of the Industrial Emissions (IPPC) Regulations (S.L. 549.77), to the extent authorised by the Permit, i.e.

“Disposal or recovery of hazardous waste with a capacity exceeding 10 tonnes per day involving repackaging prior to submission to any of the other activities listed in points 5.1 and 5.2.” And

“Temporary storage of hazardous waste not covered under point 5.4 pending any of the activities listed in points 5.1, 5.2, 5.4 and 5.6 with a total capacity exceeding 50 tonnes, excluding temporary storage, pending collection, on the site where the waste is generated.”

Aspects of the operation of the installation which are not specifically regulated by conditions in the Permit may also be subject to the condition implied by Regulation 8 of the Industrial Emissions (IPPC) Regulations, which require the Permit Holder to use the best available techniques for preventing or, where that is not practicable, reducing emissions from the installation.

Conditions marked with a ‘ ∞ ’ shall be construed as conditions which are to be enforced by the Authority responsible for such an issue.

Techniques include both the technology used and the way in which the installation is designed, built, maintained, managed, operated and decommissioned.

In some sections, the Permit conditions require the Permit Holder to use Best Available Techniques (BAT) in each of the aspects of the management of the installation to prevent and where that is not practicable, to reduce emissions. These conditions do not explain what is BAT.

A non-technical description of the installation is given in the application, but the main activity of the installation is as follows:

- **Sorting, segregation, processing and storage of non-hazardous wastes and of Waste-Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).**

Note that the Permit requires the submission of certain information to the Competent Authority (see sections 1, 2, 4 and 5). In addition, the Competent Authority has the power to seek further information at any time under regulation 11 of the Industrial Emissions (Framework) Regulations, provided that it acts reasonably.

Public Registers

This IPPC Permit and application is available to the public through the Competent Authority in accordance with the requirements of the Industrial Emissions (IPPC) Regulations. Certain information may be withheld from the public where it is commercially confidential or contrary to national security.

Variations to the Permit

This Permit may be varied by the Authority at any time in the future. If the Permit Holder wants any of the Conditions of the Permit to be changed, a formal application must be submitted to the Competent Authority.

Any change in operations shall only be implemented following the granting of a variation of the permit by the Authority.

Surrender of the Permit

Before this Permit can be wholly or partially surrendered, an Application to surrender the Permit has to be made to the Competent Authority by the Permit Holder. For the application to be successful, the Permit Holder must be able to demonstrate to the Competent Authority that there is no pollution risk and that no further steps are required to return the site to a satisfactory state.

Transfer of the Permit or part of the Permit

Upon the joint application of a Permit Holder and a proposed transferee, the Permit Holder may request to transfer an environment permit. The permit shall not be transferred from the Permit Holder without prior approval from the Authority. Upon the Authority's decision to transfer the permit to the transferee, all rights, obligations, liabilities shall subsist onto the transferee.

Section 3 – Waste

1. A new condition shall be added as Condition 3.1.17 which shall read as follows:

3.1.17 The Permit Holder shall ensure to provide:

- a. A receipt at the point of acceptance indicating the facility name, permit number, date, time and weight of the consignment, and should also bear a unique sequential number.
- b. A declaration for all the consignments of waste accepted and removed from site shall also be issued indicating the facility name, permit number, type (by EWC code), weight and final destination of the waste removed, also bearing a unique sequential number.

2. A new condition shall be added as Condition 3.1.18 which shall read as follows:

3.1.18. For packaging waste, as per obligations of S.L. 549.43, the Permit Holder shall also issue a recovery/disposal certificate (in addition to the declaration) using the certificates provided by the Authority. Examples of such certificates can be found in Schedule 8 of the Permit. Every six months, the Permit Holder shall provide the certificates to the entity from whom the waste was received (i.e. one waste packaging certificate covering January-June and July to December respectively). The duly filled certificates are to be provided as follows:

- a. The original copies of the recovery/disposal certificates are to be submitted to the Authority every six months accordingly.
- b. Digital copies are also to be submitted on an annual basis as part of the AER.

3. A new Schedule shall be added as Schedule 8 which shall read as follows:
